## Mod Vibrations MARLENE BLESSING



Having a tiny, almost invisible lobster clasp at the back of this extra-long necklace makes it easy to open, wrap, and wear as a double-strand piece.

## MATERIALS

10 turquoise/gold/rust 12 × 8mm polymer clay rondelles
20 brushed copper 9 × 4mm saucers
1 antique copper 5 × 10mm lobster clasp
1 antique copper 5mm jump ring
30" of antique copper 20-gauge craft wire
33" of antique copper 7 × 8mm flat oval/4 × 8mm figure-eight chain

## TOOLS

Wire cutters 2 pairs of chain- or flat-nose pliers Round-nose pliers

## FINISHED SIZE: 43"

**1:** Cut the chain into nine  $2\frac{1}{4}$ " pieces and two  $5\frac{1}{4}$ " pieces.

**2:** Use the jump ring to attach the lobster clasp to one end of one  $5\frac{1}{4}$  chain.

**3:** Use 3" of wire to form a wrapped loop that attaches to the free end of the previous chain. \*String 1 copper saucer, 1 polymer clay rondelle, and 1 copper saucer. Form a wrapped loop that attaches to one end of one  $2\frac{1}{4}$ " chain. Use 3" of wire to form a wrapped loop that attaches to the other end of the chain. Repeat from \* nine times, attaching the final wrapped loop to one end of the remaining  $5\frac{1}{4}$ " chain.  $\Theta$
