Make a quick pair of earrings

For each earring:

- 1. Cut two 1"-2" pieces of small cable chain.
- 2. Pass a head pin through a 6mm peridot bicone and make a wrapped loop to attach it to the end one piece of chain.
- 3. Pass a head pin through a 6mm aquamarine bicone and make a wrapped loop to attach it to the other piece of chain.
- 4. Open a beading hoop and slide the following onto the center of the hoop (back to front): a clear Bead Bumper™, a 4mm round peridot crystal, the top link on both chains, a lampworked flower bead, 4mm crystal and another Bead Bumper.
