Make Your Own 8" Interchangeable Bead Bracelet

#### **Materials & Tools**

7 interchangeable, large-hole beads 20g mixed seed beads EZ-Lobster<sup>TM</sup> clasp WildFire® beading thread Spin-N-Bead<sup>TM</sup> and curved Big Eye Needle Beadalon bead stringing glue Beading scissors

#### **Instructions**

- 1. Cut a 1-yard length of WildFire and thread it onto the needle.
- 2. Pour seed beads into the Spin-N-Bead and follow the manufacturer's instructions to load beads onto the thread, leaving four inches of thread exposed at the end.
- 3. Tie the thread in an overhand or square knot and place a drop of glue on the knot. Let it dry, then cut off the extra.
- 4. Twist and fold the beaded thread in half and then in half again. Pass all 4 beaded strands through the large-hole beads.
- 5. Attach the clasp to one end of the bracelet.
