Candie Cooper creates rosary charms with beads from John Bead.

Prayer Beads/Rosary

Materials needed

53 Clarite bellatrix crystal beads, 6mm
6 Aurum halfcoated round crystals, 8mm
118 brass spacer beads, 5mm
59 eye pins, 1"
Cross
Rosary "Y" finding
8" chain, 3mm link size
4 jump rings, 5mm
Rosary pliers

Instructions

Rosary pliers are unique because they have a cutting mechanism on the inside jaw and round nose ends to make beaded links much quicker.

- 1. Break the chain into 14 sections each measuring 3/8 of an inch.
- 2. String one brass spacer, bellatrix bead and a brass spacer onto an eye pin and finish with a loop. Repeat 52 times.
- 3. Repeat step 2 with all of the 8mm crystals and brass spacer beads.
- 4. Connect 10 bellatrix bead links together to create a chain. Repeat four more times for a total of 5, 10 link sections. Connect the remaining three bellatrix links together and set aside.
- 5. Connect a 3/8" chain section both ends of the 8mm bead link.

From here on, we'll start at the cross and work our way up and around the Rosary.

- 6. Connect an 8mm bead section to the cross with a jump ring.
- 7. Connect the 3 link bellatrix section to the end of the chain.



- 8. Connect another 8mm bead section to the last link on the bellatrix section.
- 9. Use a jump ring to attach the chain to the bottom loop on the "Y" rosary finding.
- 10. Connect a 3/8" section of chain to the top left loop on the "Y" rosary finding. From there connect a row of bellatrix links.
- 11. Connect an 8mm bead section to the end of the bellatrix links. Continue alternating, the two sections until you have used the remaining bellatrix section.
- 12. Repeat step ten, connecting a 3/8" section of chain and attaching the loop on the bellatrix links to the chain enclosing the links.
