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## 1408-1 Hardware

For jewelry makers, sometimes inspiration is as close as a trip to the hardware store. Keys and locks, gears, wire and more can serve as starting points for dynamic jewelry designs.

Katie's keyhole necklace was inspired by a collection of old keys on her dad's tool bench.

Use non-tarnish brass wire and green stone beads to make wrapped bead link chains on each side of the keyhole pendant. Make an additional beaded link to attach a key below the pendant. For each side of the necklace, pass faux suede lace through the last loop and fold it back by one-half inch. Coil wire around the folded portion to hold it in place. Use the same technique to attach a clasp to each end.
