

OVERHAND KNOTTED PEARL BRACELET by Sandra Younger

TOOLS AND MATERIALS

- <u>70" #20 HEMPTIQUE CORD</u>
- 2 10" LENGTHS WAXED JEWELRY CORD
- FOCAL WITH 3-4MM SIDE FACING HOLE
- 10 LARGE HOLEPEARLS 12MM
- 1 CLASP
- 2.5" LENGTH OF EXTENDER CHAIN (OPTIONAL)
- 1 3" HEADPIN (OPTIONAL)
- ACCENT BEAD FOR END OF EXTENDER (OPTIONAL)
- 5" LARGE EYE NEEDLE
- 6LB FISHING LINE
- SCISSORS
- KNOTTY DO-IT-ALL KIT
- THREAD MELTING TOOL






HOW TO

Step 1: Thread a leadered needle onto hemp cord at the half way at 35".

Step2: String-on clasp, 5 pearls, focal and the remaining five pearls.


Step 3: Place clasp 11" away from needle end, fold and secure with a coil knot. The long ends will be used to make the overhand knots on the bracelet.

Step 4: Tie overhand knots around each pearl and focal,




except for the last pearl.

Step 5: String extender chain onto all four cords as shown in photo. Place a peg at the 7" mark.



Step 6: Fold cord ends around peg as shown in photo.



Step 7: Tie coil knot between pearl and extender chain but before tightening, pull cord ends to close the gap between the last pearl and extender chain. You may need to remove bracelet from clips. Melt the ends of the coil knot.

Step 8: Remove bracelet from clips and trim off all excess cord.

Step 9: If you added the optional extender chain, wire wrap accent bead to end of chain.

Enjoy your bracelet!
